

National museum of agriculture



Location

The location of the museum is in Prague, Letná, more precisely in Kostelní 1300/44 . The outside is red and grey. The museum is build from bricks. From the outside you can see 4 floors, but it has an underground and a roof so in total it has 6 floors. The museum was build in 1918.

then in the main floor is the reception.

THE NATIONAL MUSEUM OF AGRICULTURE

Today we've visited the National Museum of Agriculture in Prague. It's near to the Letenské náměstí tram station and there is also a beautiful park Letná. It's a big building made of red bricks. There is also a café, so you'll not end up hungry.



History

The museum was established in 1918, but its oldest part was opened since 1842, making it probably the oldest forestry and hunting museum not only in the Czech Republic, but even in Europe.

Exhibitions

There are a lot of interesting exhibitions: Tractor on the Move with a lot of different tractors, pedal tractors for kids and tractor simulator game, Forestry where is a great atmosphere and everything smells like woods, Fishing which is modern and interactive, Gamekeeping with a great game and a lot of interesting information, Lab of Silence which makes you feel like you're in the forest, Agriculture with a lot of unique collection items, Water in the Landscape which teaches you everything about water, Exhibition with a skeleton of a horse and silly dead dog and Gastronomy which is aimed at all food lovers and should be very interesting for kids. Also, there is a Roof Garden, from where you can see the whole Prague.

Fishing

I liked all exhibitions, but I've decided that I'll write about Fishing. You will find the Fishing exhibition on the first floor. It presents traditional Czech fish farming. Fishing is one of the oldest sources of food for humans, that's why it is important for everyone to know at least something about it. There are a lot of boards with some information about fishing, dead fishes, some developing video games, a boat where you can sit at, an aquarium with fishes, fishing instruments, a kids' playground, fishing clothes that you can even try on and others.

I really liked it there because I had a feeling that I was somewhere in the countryside near to a lake because there were a lot of fake plants and animals. The exhibition is very interactive but also has a lot of important information, so no one will be bored there. I think everyone has to visit it at least once in their life.

National Museum of Agriculture

Today, we have been in The National Museum of Agriculture in Prague. It is a building close to Letná park. It was established in 1918 and it was called the Czech Agriculture Museum. If you know, in late 1918 the Czechoslovakia was made so the association was renamed Czechoslovak Museum of Agriculture, Institute for the Study and Improvement of the Countryside. Josef Kazimour was a great museologist and he participated in making the museum with Antonín Švehla who was a great politician and made it known. They built the official museum in 1930s.

I think the whole museum was great. You couldn't be bored because of how interactive it was. In the end, I enjoyed the museum a lot.

In the museum you can find exhibitions about gamekeeping, lab of silence, fishing, discovery lab, agriculture, gastronomy, and a roof garden.

We visited all of the exhibitions. And I liked the gamekeeping and fishing exhibition the most. The fishing exhibition was on the first floor. It was very interactive and that is why I liked it a lot. There were plenty of fish, alive and dead. The living ones were in an aquarium and the dead ones were in a tall glass box. There was a fake pond on the floor. You could also wear old fishing clothes and have some photos taken. The gamekeeping exhibition was also on the first floor and it was really interesting. You could listen to animals and then guess on a tablet which animal it was. Play a videogame with your friends where one of you was a hunter and had a weapon for shooting the animals. In the exhibition there were replicas of the things that gamekeepers used. Another exhibition I liked in the museum was the rooftop. You could see whole Prague from there. The view was great itself.
